Torn Between Two Lovers

I. Jesus knew a few things about treasures.

A. He had left the treasures of heaven.

1. In the words of the Apostle John,
“The Word became flesh.”
2. He was thoroughly qualified to speak about treasures.

B. He also knew the hearts of people.

1. We can sometimes have divided loyalties.
2. We can be torn between two lovers.
3. Jesus knew how much we love money.

C. There are 3 Lessons to be learned.

1. Lesson 1: It matters where we invest.
2. Lesson 2: We must have good eyes.
3. Lesson 3: We must choose a Master.

B. Our eyes must be generous and good.

1. We may be thinking in the wrong way.
2. The Lord wants us to have a generous eye.

3. What may be affecting your outlook?

C. We must choose our Master wisely.

1. No one can choose to be their own master.
2. Our choice is between God and Satan!
3. Many people choose like the rich young man. ~ ***Luke 18:18-30***

A. All of us need examples to follow.

1. Mr. Distressed only looks within.
2. Sister Defeated always looks back.
3. Dr. Distracted is always looking around.
