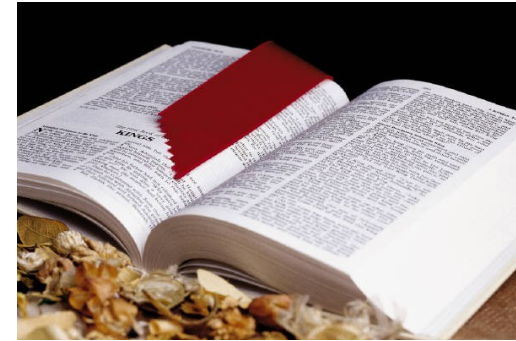

## What Will a Man Give?



- I. **Introduction: What is your most highly valued possession?**
- A. Some people think about their material possessions.
    - 1. We value our houses or real estate.
    - 2. We also love our cars, clothing and jewelry.
  - B. How many people thought about spiritual possessions?
    - 1. Jesus told us that our souls are priceless!
    - 2. *“What will a man give in exchange for his soul?”*  
~ *Matthew 16:26*
  - C. Why is the soul so valuable?
    - 1. The highest price was paid for the soul.
    - 2. The soul will last forever.
- II. **Body: What will a person give for his soul?**
- A. Achan sold out for some gold, silver and a robe.  
~ *Joshua 7*
    - 1. His entire family had to pay the price for his sin.
    - 2. It was not worth the price that he paid.
  - B. There was a rich man who made a bad investment.  
~ *Luke 16:19-31*
    - 1. He sold out his soul for a life of luxury.
    - 2. He had many regrets about the price that he paid.
  - C. Ananias and Sapphira sold out because of greed.  
~ *Acts 5:1-11*
    - 1. They both lied and died on the same day.
    - 2. The money they kept was not even the issue.

## Matthew 16:24-27

- III. **Conclusion: Is it worth the price that we pay as Christians?**
- A. Discipleship is worth the price we must pay.
    - 1. We step by on faith by dethroning the king.
    - 2. We continue on our way by the walk of death.
    - 3. We finish our journey walking the way of the disciple.
  - B. The gospel of Christ is worth sharing.
    - 1. It is a powerful message. (*Romans 1:16*)
    - 2. It is a precious message. (*1 Corinthians 9:23*)
  - C. Souls are worth saving!
    - 1. Jesus died for the salvation of every soul.
    - 2. Let's be willing to pay the price.
